

Ordinance 1961-1

An Ordinance Proposing Annexation To Certain Area Contiguous To Present City of Walton, Kentucky Limits.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Walton City Council, that it is necessary in order to provide for the orderly and beneficial growth of said City, and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Walton, Kentucky deems it necessary and advisable to pass such ordinance proposing annexation of such area contiguous to the pre-

sent City Limits, NOW therefore be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Walton, Kentucky,

THAT, the area of said proposed annexation shall be the following legal description of annexation boundary for the City of Walton, Kentucky to wit:

Lying generally West and contiguous with the western City limits of the City of Walton and described more particularly as follows: Beginning at a point in the present City line (January, 1961) at the intersection of the centerlines of Central Avenue and Stephenson Mill Road; thence with said city line, Northwest, crossing the Beaver Road, 1050 feet to a point therein; thence continuing with said city line, Northeast, a distance of 1390 feet, or sufficient to reach a corner with said city line in the North line of the Bedinger (Mary A. Yealey) tract; thence there-with N 78-30 W 750 feet more or less, to the Northwest corner of said tract; thence West at right angles to the Interstate Highway I-75, 1250 feet to a point in the East line thereof; thence South with said East line of said Highway, 350 feet or sufficient to reach the Southwest line of the G. W. Ryan tract; thence

Southeast with said line of said Ryan tract 1640 feet more or less, to a corner of the J. Dance tract; thence Southeast with the East line of said tract 200 feet or sufficient to reach the North line of the Beaver Rural Highway; thence in a Westerly direction with said North line of said highway 1050 feet or sufficient to reach a point in the East line of the Interstate Highway I-75; thence with said East line, North 230 feet to a point; thence crossing said highway at right angles thereto, West a distance of 650 feet more or less, to a point in the North line of the Beaver Rural Highway; thence Southwest, 60 feet to a point in the South line of said Highway; thence with the Southwest line of said highway as relocated and with a curve to the right or West, Southeast a distance of 450 feet to a point in the West line of said highway, as relocated; thence with the West line of the relocated Beaver Rural Highway, South, a distance of 3600 feet to a point; thence continuing with said West line, South 1650 feet to a point in the West line of Ky. Highway No. 16 at its original location; thence crossing said highway, Southeast 60 feet to a point in the East line thereof; thence with the East line of Ky. Highway No. 16, as originally located, Northeast 600 feet more or less, to the West line of the Interstate Highway I-75; thence therewith South 250 feet to a point therein; thence crossing said highway at right angles and the service road on the East side thereof, East a distance of 380 feet to a point in the East line of said service road; thence North with said East line of said service road 400 feet to a point in the South line of Ky. Highway No. 16 as originally located; thence in a Northeasterly direction with said South line of said original location of Ky. Hwy. No. 16, 1850 feet to a point the projection of the present West line of the City of Walton; thence crossing said highway, North 65 feet to a point in the North line of said Highway No. 16; thence with the North line of said original location of Highway No. 16, and in a Southwesterly direction 1850 feet, more or less, to a point in the East line of the Interstate Highway; thence with said East line of said highway and its approaches, North 200 feet, Northeast 700 feet, Northwest 1050 feet, North 225 feet to a point in the South line of Stephenson Mill Road; thence along said line of Stephenson Mill Road Northeast 1000 feet to a point at the projection of the present City line; thence North 20 feet to a corner with the present city line in the center of the Stephenson Mill Road; thence Northeast along the center of said Stephenson Mill Road and with the pre-

sent city line 1600 feet or sufficient to reach the place of beginning.

Passed by unanimous vote of Council present and voting this 23rd day of January, 1961, and ordered published four times as required by law in the Walton Advertiser.

Resolution 1961-2

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the City Council of the City of Walton, Kentucky, that it is necessary in order to provide adequate fire protection and a sufficient water supply to the citizens and residents of the area of the City of Walton, beginning at the end of the present four inch waterline on Beaver Road and running Westwardly along the North side of Beaver Road, a distance of 1185 lineal feet or sufficient distance to reach the City Limits of said City-as now existing.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Walton, Kentucky, deems it advisable and necessary to improve the existing water facilities in said city area by the laying of new water mains along said Beaver Road within the described limits.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WALTON, KENTUCKY,

THAT, the route of said proposed improvement shall be on the North side of Beaver Road in the City of Walton, Kentucky, in the area beginning at the end of the existing four inch water main on Beaver Road and running Westwardly along said Road a distance of 1185 lineal feet or sufficient to reach the existing City Limits.

Said improvements shall consist of the laying of a new six inch water line or main together with the necessary fire hydrants or plugs and all necessary connections and fittings appertant thereto as specified by the plans of Noel Walton, City Engineer.

Said improvement is hereby declared to be a necessity. Said improvement is to be paid for by the City for a specified part of the cost and the balance shall be paid by the benefited property owners.

Resolution 1961-3

WHEREAS the City of Walton, Kentucky, has improved Central Avenue of said City from Station 0-00 at and opposite the projection of the Northeast line of Lot No. 24 of the High School Court Subdivision Southwestwardly and Northwestwardly along Central Avenue to Station 10-25 at the Stephenson Mill Road with a 14 feet width base course of stone with the necessary grade and drain appurtenances and;

WHEREAS said base course and appurtenances have been designated as the first stage of a stage improvement to said Central Avenue and;

WHEREAS the construction of a finished high type surface on said street or avenue is required to complete said stage improvement;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WALTON, KENTUCKY;

THAT the City shall construct thereon a two-ply surface improvement consisting of a binder and a

wearing course of 158 tons of Class I bituminous plant mix.

THAT the said stage improvement shall be constructed according to the plans prepared by Noel Walton, City Engineer,

SAID improvement is hereby declared to be a necessity;

SAID improvement is to be paid for by the benefited property owners.
