DELEGATIONS

ROAD CLOSING - ALLEY #1 - McVILLE

Judge Ferguson moved to Delegations and called to order a public hearing on the closing of Alley 1 in McVilleville, and called upon Harvey Pelley for a report regarding the closing of Alley 1 in McVilleville. Mr. Pelley advised the court that a viewer's committee had reviewed the situation and were recommending that this be closed.

Judge Ferguson confirmed that Doug Tomlinson, the petitioner for the closing was present and that no comments had been received in his office verbally or in writing and since no one was present to object at the meeting he would recommend that the court proceed. Commissioner Raverty moved for the closing of Alley #1 in McVilleville, and Commissioner Robinson seconded the motion. Hearing no objection Judge Ferguson called for the vote, Commissioner Raverty voted AYE, Commissioner Robinson voted AYE, Commissioner Davis voted AYE, and Judge Ferguson's vote to reflect the will of the majority. Judge Ferguson stated that the alley would be closed with conditions placed on this by the viewer's committee, that the county reserve utility rights for the property.

ROAD CLOSING - FIFTH STREET - BELLEVIEW

Judge Ferguson declared a public hearing to be in session regarding the closing of Fifth Street in Belleview. Having confirmed that Robert Dennison, petitioner for the closing, was present Judge Ferguson called on Harvey Pelley for a report. Mr. Pelley advised that the viewer's committee would recommend the closing of same, with the condition that the county reserve all utility rights existing on the property.

Advising that no comments have been received in the office of the County Judge/Executive, Judge Ferguson called for a motion to accept the committee's recommendation to close this street. Commissioner Raverty moved approval to close Fifth Street in Belleview with the stated condition and Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Hearing no discussion Judge Ferguson called for a vote on the motion, Commissioner Raverty voted AYE, Commissioner Robinson voted AYE, Commissioner Davis voted AYE, and Judge Ferguson's vote to reflect the will of the majority. Judge Ferguson then declared the public hearing to be closed.
