Judge Roberts advised the Court that the recently constructed Richardson Road Bridge was settling on the Boone County approach side; and, advised that some settling was normal but the bridge would be watched; and, advised that the underwriter of Cincinnati Contractors, Inc., contractor of the bridge, recommended not releasing the bid bond of the contractor until all invoices have been proven paid. Commissioner Weaver confirmed with Judge Roberts that Cincinnati Contractors, Inc. had patched the bridge and suggested a sealant preventing future or further water damage. Commissioner Robinson agreed that specific maintenance should be maintained and advised that the bridge probably should not be settling this much creating problems of this type so soon after construction. Judge Roberts advised he would use all preventive measures possible relative to the bridge and retain the bid bond until the underwriters were satisfied that invoices have been paid by the contractor.

Judge Roberts recognized Larry Crigler, County Attorney, who submitted to the Court a Production Agreement between Morgan Productions, Inc. and the Juvenile Department the production of a one-hour videotaped documentary on the general topic of juvenile justice; and, advised that said Agreement was in order for the Court's consideration of approval. Commissioner Robinson advised the Court that the referred attachment "Exhibit A" was not attached to the Agreement and recommended tabling this item pending the review of "Exhibit A". Judge Roberts confirmed the consensus of the Court to be in agreement of approving the Production Agreement after "Exhibit A" had been identified. (See Court Minutes of 12/29/82 for Court approval of said Production Agreement.)

Larry Crigler, County Attorney, relative to Larry Ramsey's, Breezy Road, appearance before the Court on 12/07/82, recommended the Court grant a quit-claim deed to Mr. Ramsey based upon a report received from the County Surveyor, David Walton, for the public roadway requested to be closed by Mr. Ramsey. A motion was made by Ronald Robinson, seconded by Irene Patrick, authorizing the County Judge/Executive to execute a quit-claim deed on behalf of Mr. Larry Ramsey relative to Breezy Road. Commissioner Weaver confirmed with Larry Crigler, County Attorney, that there were no adjoining property owners who objected to this transaction. There being no further discussion, Judge Roberts called for a vote to the motion as presented by Commissioner Robinson. Ronald Robinson voted AYE, Irene Patrick voted AYE, John Weaver voted AYE, and Judge Roberts voted AYE. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Weaver advised the Court that it had been brought to his attention that in the recent publication of Ordinance No. (410.3), an Ordinance relating to times of days alcohol may be sold or otherwise trafficked in or transferred in Boone County, was in error relative to hours specified within Section (a) of said Ordinance. Larry Crigler, County Attorney, advised that the Ordinance would be re-published to clarify any error in publication.

Larry Crigler, County Attorney, recommended the Court grant a quit-claim deed to Mr. Ensminger, E. Mt. Zion Road for a school bus turn-around acquired by the County but never used. A motion was made by John Weaver, seconded by Irene Patrick, authorizing the County Judge/Executive to execute a quit-claim deed on behalf of Mr. Ensminger relative to E. Mt. Zion Road as recommended by the County Attorney. There being no discussion, Judge Roberts called for a vote. John Weaver voted AYE, Irene Patrick voted AYE, Ronald Robinson voted AYE, and Judge Roberts voted AYE. The motion passed unanimously.

Larry Crigler, County Attorney, recommended the Court authorize Marlene Smith, Animal Shelter Director and Dog Warden for the County, to be an Auxiliary Policeman based upon an Attorney General's opinion received relative to enforcing the County's Ordinance regarding dogs running at large. Larry Crigler also advised of the need to consider amending the present Ordinance to allow for disposition of dogs who were sheltered and had a license; but, never claimed by owners. It was the consensus of the Court to appoint Marlene Smith as an Auxiliary Policeman and have the County Attorney's draft an amendment as needed for the present Ordinance regarding dogs running at large.
