Two bids were submitted to the Court for the purchase of the Old Gravel Pit
on Rabbit Hash Road. The bids were submitted as follows:

Mary Lou Aylor, Ronnie Aylor, & Robert Doane...\$1500.00
W.J. Craig\$ 200.00

A motion was made by David Houston, seconded by Galen McGlasson that the bid
of \$1500.00 be accepted. All voted Aye.

Mr. Rector Jones of the Boone County Board of Education filed with the Court
the budget for the school year 1972-73. A tax levy of 64¢ on each \$100.00
valuation of all property real and personal; and a levy of 38¢ on each
\$100.00 valuation of all Bank Shares. The Court approved the tax rate.
Mr. McGlasson made the motion, seconded by David Houston. All voted Aye.

Mr. Robert R. Miller submitted a letter read by Mr. McEvoy telling the Court
of his attempts to obtain Mrs. Mary Henson's signature for a right-of-way
deed on Merrell Road. A motion was made to offer Mrs. Henson \$50.00 for said
road right-of-way. The motion was made by Mr. McGlasson, seconded by Mr. Houston.
All voted Aye.

Mr. Schnieder of the Kenton County Airport Board presented a petition to
discontinue abandoned county roads on or adjacent to airport property.

The report of the commissioner's appointed to view Donald Road be closed.
All voted Aye. *Crume made motion & McGlasson*
seconded all voted aye
Noel Walton presented a bill for preparing a map of the land to be
purchased for a park.

Mr. Burnam Roberts presented his building inspectors report for the month
of July, 1972. Total permits issued 31, Estimated value \$381,800.00,
Amount paid \$1421.60 (including \$200.00 for 2 culberts)

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Boone County and the Department of Highways of Kentucky have
an existing Contract, dated April 26, 1972, and
WHEREAS, Boone County, it is desired to revise the said Contract,
NOW THEREFORE, On motion of Esquire Houston, seconded by Esquire McGlasson
it is Resolved by the Fiscal Court of Boone County that the said Contract be
revised and the said Fiscal Court directs Bruce Ferguson, the County Judge
of Boone County, to enter into a Supplemental Agreement carrying out the
purposes of said revision.
The Supplemental Agreement calls for Beaver Road to be improved from US 25
to I-75.

Janet Bell and Dave Burger of OKI came to Fiscal Court to become acquainted
with it's members and to discuss the housing problems developing within the
county.

Dr. Willett, chairmen of the Mental Health and Mental Retardation Board,
introduced the members on the board which represented Boone County. He
explained the functions of the board and told the Court that to effectively
serve the county with their programs that three treatment offices and a
reception room was needed to be furnished by the County. These offices
would serve Boone County and some of Gallatin County.

A motion was made by Mr. McGlasson and seconded by Dr. Crume to place a bond
issue on the November ballot to fund the building of a new jail. A
resolution will be prepared. *by J. J. Reusch & Co.*


Gentlemen:

In response to an order from the Fiscal Court directing us to view and report on Donald Road, we Noel Walton, David G. Walton and Charles Taylor have viewed said road and beg to report as follows:

The section of road sought to be closed is the West 190 feet more or less of Donald Road running from the Northward projection of the common line of lots numbers 39 and 40, Section II, Hopeful Heights Subdivision Westwardly 190 feet more or less to the West line of said subdivision. The suppliant William Tupman and his wife own all the land on the North, South and West sides of said road. Said section of road is unimproved and there are no utilities or structures on it.

As of the present time and circumstances we can find no inconvenience, hardship or damage which might result to the public in closing said section of said Donald Road.
