THE BOONE COUNTY FISCAL COURT WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY JUDGE BRUCE FERGUSON ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 1975 AT 7:30 P. M. IN THE COUROOM, BOONE COUNTY COURTHOUSE, BURLINGTON, KENTUCKY.

PRESENT: MR. DAVID HOUSTON, COMMISSIONER
MR. KENNETH LUCAS, COMMISSIONER
MR. WILLIAM P. MCEVOY, COUNTY ATTORNEY

ABSENT: MR. GALEN MCGLASSON, COMMISSIONER

JUDGE BRUCE FERGUSON OPENED THE FISCAL COURT MEETING BY LEADING THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY KEN LUCAS, SECONDED BY DICK HOUSTON, ALL VOTING AYE TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE FISCAL COURT MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 4, 1975.

FIVE MEMBERS OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE WHICH WERE APPOINTED BY JUDGE FERGUSON ATTENDED THE FISCAL COURT MEETING AND DISCUSSED THE PROJECT OF STUDYING THE COUNTY BUDGET AND ANY OTHER MEANS THE COMMITTEE CAN INVESTIGATE TO OBTAIN THE NEEDED REVENUE FOR A JAIL POLICE STATION, AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES. THE COURT NOTED THAT THEY WELCOMED CITIZEN INPUT AND NEW IDEAS. THE COURT WOULD SERIOUSLY CONSIDER ANY FEASIBLE RECOMMENDATIONS THAT THE COMMITTEE MAY RENDER. MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE PRESENT AT THE COURT MEETING WERE: BILL SHOTWELL, CHAIRMAN, BOB TAYLOR, JUNE ROUSE, BILL TALLMAN AND SEWARD ABBOTT.

A PUBLIC HEARING WAS HELD ON THE PROPOSED CLOSING OF A PORTION OF HOPWELL ROAD. HUGH SKEES, ATTORNEY ON BEHALF OF THE PETITIONERS, JIM RANSOM AND FRANCES WILSON STATED THE REASONS FOR PETITIONING TO HAVE THE ROAD CLOSED. THOMAS CONROY, ATTORNEY STATED THE CASE ON BEHALF OF JEAN VEGA AND HIMSELF WHO WANTED THE ROAD TO REMAIN OPEN. AFTER REVIEWING ALL FACTS PRESENTED, A MOTION WAS MADE BY DICK HOSUTON, SECONDED BY KEN LUCAS, ALL VOTING AYE TO CLOSE THE PORTION OF HOPWELL ROAD AS PRESENTED BY THE PETITIONERS.

WILLIAM MCEVOY, COUNT ATTORNEY PRESENTED A PROPOSED ORDINANCE RELATING TO CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS. JACK BARRY, DIRECTOR OF SECURITY OF THE GREATER CINCINNATI AIRPORT SPOKE FOR THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE AND HUGH SKEES SPOKE AGAINST THE ORDINANCE. A MOTION WAS MADE BY KEN LUCAS, SECONDED BY DICK HOUSTON, ALL VOTING AYE TO ADOPT ORDINANCE #16, AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS AS PRESENTED. TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT ON THE 1ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1976. SAID ORDINANCE IS IN WORDS AND FIGURES AS FOLLOWS:
