Mr. L. C. Shull of Gunpowder Road presented the Court with a petition of property owners to rename the Evergreen Extention of that road Sunnybrook Road. Mr. Charles Carpenter moved that it be so ordered. Mr. David Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried with all voting "Aye".

Seven delegates of Utz Lane were before the Court requesting that something be done for the betterment of that road. The court stated after due discussion of the matter, that they couldn't get to it this year, but if they would get all the property owners to sign right of way deeds they could probably get it on the agenda for next year.

Mr. Eubank and Mr. Richey of the Health Dept. and their Supervisor Mr. Wallance reported to the court that Ohio trucks were dumping material in an unauthorized portion of the county. Also, it was stated that there would be a hearing on the 17th for further discussion of the problem and of a possible solution.

A letter was read from Mr. James Morris stating that the county tax rate for 1967 had been computed as .203 per \$100 valuation as recommended **and .19 per each \$100 valuation of all bank shares** by the state. Mr. David Houston moved that this rate be accepted. Mr. Charles Carpenter seconded the motion. Motion carried with all voting "Aye".
